- 3) **Only for today**, I will be happy in the certainty that I was created to be happy, not only in the other world but also in this one.
- 4) **Only for today**, I will adapt to circumstances, without requiring all circumstances to be adapted to my own wishes.
- 5) **Only for today**, I will devote 10 minutes of my time to some good reading, remembering that just as food is necessary to the life of the body, so good reading is necessary to the life of the soul.
- 6) **Only for today**, I will do one good deed and not tell anyone about it.
- 7) **Only for today**, I will do at least one thing I do not like doing; and if my feelings are hurt, I will make sure that no one notices.
- 8) **Only for today**, I will make a plan for myself: I may not follow it to the letter, but I will make it. And I will be on guard against two evils: hastiness and indecision.
- 9) **Only for today**, I will firmly believe, despite appearances, that the good Providence of God cares for me as no one else who exists in this world.

Presentation of the Lord, Feb. 2nd



On the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, the liturgy celebrates primarily the entrance of the Infant Jesus into the temple for the first time. Nothing seems out of the ordinary, just a typical Jewish mother and father coming to the temple 40 days after the birth of their firstborn to fulfill the Mosaic law.
